FROM THE PASTOR

Our life as a congregation is moving somewhere...

Summer is almost here. For those still in school, their parents, or who work with schools, this makes more difference than to others. Yet whether school is still a part of your life or not, this time of year reminds us of the cycles that are a part of all of our lives.

Every day is a cycle: morning, noon, afternoon, evening, night. Breakfast, lunch, dinner. Wake, work, relax, sleep. Worship, work, work, work, work, work, work, work, rest. Our lives are made of cycles of many durations.

Sometimes we think of life as linear; as though we are moving in some direction

progress over time. Within a Christian worldview, we do understand that life, time, history started somewhere and is going somewhere. But even within this progress, or growth, or maturity, our lives are made up of cycles. It's like we are moving in a spiral towards eternity rather than merely a line.

The same thing is true for churches as for people. Our life as a congregation is moving somewhere, going in a certain direction, but it is also going through cycles. One of these cycles we go through as a liturgical church is the church calendar. The Christian year begins with

Advent, moves through Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, and, of course, Easter. Several weeks after Easter we observe Pentecost. The rest of the year, as much as 26 weeks, is called Ordinary Time.

We have just begun Ordinary Time. In our culture, "ordinary" is not usually taken as a good thing. I think, though, that ordinary is a very, very good thing. I believe most of us live most of our lives in spaces and situations that are, well, ordinary.

May you find God present in your ordinary time as well as our Ordinary Time!



by Stanley Hauerwas and William


