Eules First has a tremendous opportunity that is knocking on our door right now. One of our church families has **offered \$110,000, if we will match it, to Burn the Debt – to make our church debt free!**

We have a dream at Eules First United Methodist Church, for all of us to follow Jesus Christ a bit better today than yesterday. We believe that this is lived out through small groups that hold us accountable, diligent study, and bold service in the world. Eules First is at a great place in ministry!

- Our Food Pantry is busting at the seams and is expanding its hours to better serve the community. They are also now helping people with pet food.
- We served 100 kids for Vacation Bible School this summer.
- Our Preschool is having record enrollment with 140 students.
- The Laundromat Ministry is

doing ground-breaking outreach and receiving grants for their efforts. We had our first family join the church in part because of this ministry

- A new Sunday School class was started in the last year, and we have a very active Sunday School ministry.

God is at work among us, and blessing us to be a blessing! We know that Eules is looking at many changes in the next couple of years with the expansion of Hwy 183. What an exciting adventure for us!

Pastor Steve has been preaching about John Wesley for the last couple of weeks. Wesley truly was a *Man on Fire*. It is fair to say that Eules First is also on fire. We are on fire for following Christ a bit better today than yesterday.

It is time to share with you this exciting news of a wonderful opportunity to burn our debt, and get the fire started for our future dreams. We owe a bit less than \$220,000 on the expansion of the Heyl Building that was added in 2002. One of the

families in our congregation has taken on this challenge by pledging half of this amount **IF** the rest of us will join together and match their gift.

We invite you to respond now to this opportunity to Burn the Debt by December 31, 2015. Please take some time to prayerfully consider how you would like to participate in this great opportunity to enable our church to face the next chapter of our history debt free. Over the next couple of weeks you will receive a pledge card. Whether your pledge is \$50 or \$25,000 we need as many of our flock to step up to achieve this milestone together. 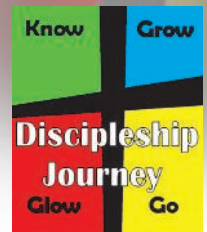

FROM THE PASTOR

"Judgmental" is one of the first words that people who are not part of a church use to describe Christians. Some Christians respond to this by going out of their way NOT to come across as judgmental.

One of the ways some people avoid coming across as religious bigots is simply to hide the fact that they are people of faith.

I have been there. But, I think there are better ways to deal with the stereotype. After all, following Jesus has made a huge difference in my life and in who I am. I want to share this with others, and I want to do so in ways that are not judgmental.

I have decided to take the next few newsletters to share some things that might be helpful for

sharing your faith with others. This simple steps are intending to be helpful in ever context: co-workers, family members (even your parents and your children), people in line behind you at the grocery store.

Here's the first step. Get to know your story. This won't surprise you, as I have talked about it many times since coming to Eules. The best story you can tell about the value of following Jesus is your own story. In fact, telling someone else's, anyone else's story will ring hollow at best, or sound judgmental at worst.

So, what is your story of following Jesus? It would help to write it down, type it out. (Don't post your first draft

to social media). Get it all out there in front of you, warts and all. Successes, failures. mountain-top experiences and times that you've felt like you were crawling through the valley of the shadow of death alone.

When did you first start following Jesus? Have you been through long spells when, maybe, you were not following very closely? Have you ever followed so closely that it felt like Jesus was kicking up dust on you?

The best way to share your faith is to know your story.

FACTS AND QUESTIONS— BURN OUR DEBT

Here is a rundown of some facts and figures that will hopefully answer all of your question as we Burn Our Debt. Back in 2002, we remodeled and expanded our education building at a cost of \$1,000,000. Today the balance of the remaining debt is less than \$220,000. Our finance team, with encouragement from a church member's generous challenge to pay half of the debt if we pay the rest, is going to take the big step and wipe out that balance totally as a strategic financial measure for the future.

Do we save interest by paying it off early? Yes, we have 12 years left on the note and by paying it off early, almost all monies pledged and paid go to principal not interest.

How is this different from the General Budget? Each year, usually in the fall, we ask our flock to commit to their weekly support of this church and its ministries. That includes Facility expenses, Salaries, Utilities, Missions and the day to day requirements needed on our 8 acre campus. Our annual budget is approximately \$600,000. Our building debt has been a separate budget and we have had our flock paying that

bill since 2002. Most recently a campaign called "Tomorrow Depends on you Today" helped move that debt from \$850,000 to \$500,000. A second campaign, called "Forward in Faith," in 2007 reduced the debt from \$500,000 to the current \$216,000. This final step is a financial project to wipe it out in 15 months.

What if I don't have much money to put toward this project? Our church's philosophy has always been "Not equal giving, but equal sacrifice." All of us are in different places in our lives. We ask you to study where you are and make a commitment of any amount to help. Our church is in a very healthy position currently and we believe we have the momentum and passion to gain the required funds to eliminate this debt quickly. We have many church members who have encouraged us to take this step and we believe we may receive pledges that may surpass the debt owed. Please pray about your part in this project.

Will we have another campaign after this one? The highway expansion project has a lot of unknowns at this time, but we believe we will have campus impacts from the expansion of the highway. When that occurs, building construction may be

required. We expect there may be a need for a capital campaign in the future for funding these projects? It is too early to speculate specifics.
