ABUNDANCE

Over the last four weeks Pastor Steve has beautifully given us a different look into God's abundance in our lives. We began this journey by looking at how we can live into abundance, verses living in scarcity. If we live in scarcity we hold on desperately to all that we have, yet in abundance we are free to love others unashamedly and can share all that God has given us. Next, he spoke with us about priorities in our lives. From there, we learned about the need to receive. Steve shared with us 1 John 4:20, "If anyone says, I love God, and hates a brother or sister, he is a liar, because the person who doesn't love a brother or sister who can be seen can't love God, who can't be seen." He challenged us further to think about receiving in the same way. Steve said, "If anyone says, I receive God's love, and does not receive from a brother or sister, he



is a liar, because the person who does not receive from a brother or sister who can be seen can't receive from God, who can't be seen." We were all convicted to let others give to us in new ways.

This last Sunday Steve spoke about giving. Research shows that those who give more are happier than those who don't. If you are looking to be a more joy-filled person, giving is a wonderful step.

FROM THE PASTOR

I am already thinking in Christmas terms and it isn't even Thanksgiving! At least, that's how I felt this afternoon when I turned someone away because the inn was full. Actually, I don't know if the inn was full, because I am not the innkeeper. But, someone had called here needing the money for a night's stay in a local motel. I turned her away.

Though many of you give generously to support exactly this kind of need through our Pastor's Emergency Fund, we had no such funds available this afternoon. Sometimes I would just pull out my own credit card and take care of it, but today I didn't feel that was the best response.

Here's the reason I share this experience with you. This person was determined and insistent on the phone to make sure I knew they are a member of this church. I didn't recognize the name. But that isn't a deal breaker; our church is big enough that everyone doesn't know everyone else.

The challenge to me was the reminder that they were a church member. It came across as though I was being told they DESERVE the help because they are a member.

Remember those American Express commercials from the late 80s? The tag line was "Membership has its privileges." Ever since, some people have confused the church with American Express. If you'll remember, though, the liturgy of becoming a member of the church is more about accepting responsibilities (supporting it with prayers, presence, gifts, service, and witness) than about privileges gained.

This wasn't a conversation, though, where it felt right to turn the discussion toward responsibilities and away from privileges. No, instead, I went another route. I asked this person if there were a Sunday School class or small group of some kind that they were connected with. The response was a rather testy (I said I am a member of your church!")

I wished this person had some connection with someone in the church they in fact had joined. They did not. They could not give me one name of one person or group within the church.

Sadly, I realized I (we) don't do as well as we should in welcoming new members. If being a member here means anything, I believe it ought to mean that one is connected with others. The most common form of this connection is Sunday School or Choir or Alpha or some other small group. But there are a few who attend worship and no other small group that are still connected with others. These connections are essential for our living as the Body of Christ. They are a foundational part of how I understand "following Jesus a bit better today than yesterday." Finally, connections give us a group of people we can go to when we need help. We all deserve that, but it requires something of us.

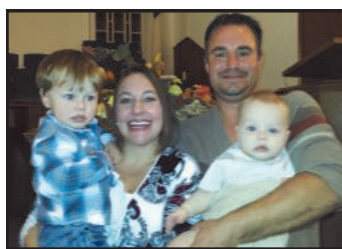

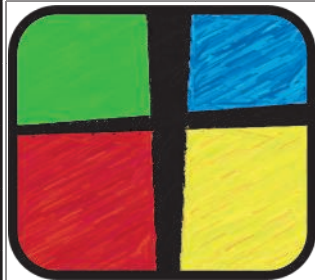
