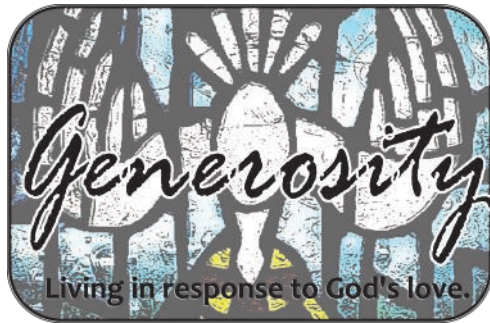

FROM THE PASTOR

The Dead Sea, contrary to its name, is not quite dead. Its water is too salty for either plant or fish life, but it does support limited amounts of bacterial life.

The Jordan river, of biblical fame, flows into the Dead Sea. The Jordan is the river across which the people of Israel came to take possession of the Promised Land, in which Jesus himself was baptized. The Jordan supports life - many varieties of both fish and plants.

What's the difference? Why does the river support life while the sea doesn't?



The Dead Sea is dead because it has no outlet. Water flows into the Dead Sea from the Jordan and a number of other sources, but there are no rivers or streams that flow out of it.

Our lives work just like these bodies of water. If we only receive, we lose the ability to support life.

Giving is important. This month we are focusing mostly on financial giving, but this

principle is true for every facet of life. God, the abundantly generous God who calls us to follow Jesus, offers to save us from sin and heal our brokenness, exuding life and love. God does not hold back.

As we learn to live in the presence of God, we find God's generosity rubbing off on us.

Or, to stay with the aquatic metaphor, we open ourselves to God's life, love, peace, etc. flowing into and out through us.

It is a joy to be a part of a congregation through which so much of God's love flows. Thank you for your part.

You are invited! Join us for a fun evening to kick off the holiday season as a family. **December 7, at 5:00 p.m.** for

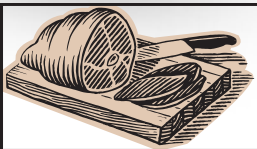
"How the Grinch Stole Christmas." Since the movie itself is only 27 minutes long, we will begin the evening with

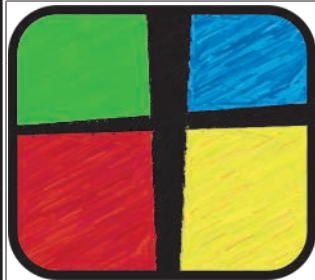
